* Campo, Nostalgia of the future (2004)

A documentary with subject matter covering some of the social issues and everyday situations of the inhabitants of Campo. Its protagonists discuss their concerns about the present and future of the village. A documentary that aims to mix various digital formats and techniques to create a type of synthetic puzzle that aims to offer a view of various issues of interest to the people in the village. A number of subjects are considered based on a series of stories and characters that are followed throughout the narrative: the documentary looks at what the inhabitants think about the city and the pace of life, the fact that the village's young people have to leave for large towns, trade and the future, among other subjects. Campo, nostalgia of the future is divided into themed chapters or units which can be viewed separately. The documentary was distributed at various points in the Aragon Autonomous Region and was shown twice at the Patron Saint Festival in August 2004/2005.

and the Internet. An experimental piece combining real and synthetic images, from the media and the Internet. Its subject matter covers the period between New York 9/11 and the Madrid train bombs.

* Urban Dream (2004)

A piece recreating the city as the urban construction of chaos. It uses sonic and visual metaphors to subjectively suggest that various moral shortcomings and needs of the city. "Urban Dream" looks at the emerging need to return to lost values and new morals for urban man. We enter the dense human jungle, and by means of abstraction and playing with visual and sound metaphors, it suggests things to us. The city is presented as the urban construction of chaos, as a mixture between excess and underlying multiculturalism.

All the images are original and recorded in Barcelona and the sounds are recorded on a MiniDisc and digitally manipulated with a computer. The idea is to mix these footage and to create a symbolic journey on which the viewer feels like a participant in the story and gives it the meaning he/she considers appropriate, with all the ambiguity that the piece entails. XXI... Great Barcelona and Urban Dream are the result of the specialisation in various Video Production subjects on the Master's Degree in Digital Arts taken between 2003 and 2005 at Pompeu Fabra University.

* Fractal composition (2004)

3D interface created using fractals, which seeks the pleasure involved in playing with them. Browsing the material based on its structure introduces us to audiovisual content that illustrates this concept. Fractal is the infinite iteration of a simple process. A fractal object can be recognised by the high degree of similarity between its parts, i.e. an object has a specific form, and if we increase the zoom we can see that the same form repeats itself, and if we increase again it does so again, and so on, according to the theory, ad infinitum. Until the twentieth century, the study of geometry was based on the theories of Euclid (3rd century BC) on dimensions: a point has zero dimensions, a line has one dimension, a plane has two dimensions (which can go in two directions) and a cube has three dimensions (x, y and, z). However, cases began to appear in which this type of geometry did not provide satisfactory answers. During the nineteenth century, new mathematical theories were developed that called the accepted principles into question.

This led to the birth of hyperbolic geometry, the ellipse, topology and fractal geometry. A fractal form is and object that is the result of the repetition (iteration) of a mathematical operation (a function). This description of "complex" models by Fractal geometry, which are beyond the scope of the laws of Euclidean geometry, can be used to understand the models of organisation that can be found in nature, which are apparently chaotic (the most frequently mentioned are the leaf of a fern, a snowflake, clouds, blood vessels or a coastline). In this project, fractals are considered intuitively, seeking the pleasure involved in playing with them, the ma concept.

* Industrial composition (2004)

An interface that recreates an industrial atmosphere, with a creative concept based on the humanisation of machines and humans' identification with them. It uses sound and graphic features to make users experience the machine as if they were part of it. In the industry, there is an attitude that ridicules certain ideological standpoints in modern society, which criticises industry, while using the objects it produces every day. When the first Industrial Revolution took place, it was criticised by some intellectual sectors of the bourgeoisie. They were against industry, because it led to man's alienation; workers in the suburbs were derided, while those in rural areas were idealised. It was an attitude of criticism-idealisation, based on ignorance of both situations, which was particularly common in the Romantic era.

This school of thought is still common today, but has been adapted to modern society, as can be seen by the various opinions that can be heard "at street level." It is a criticism of industry, technology, from an idealist perspective, that is not consistent with its actions, as it uses what it criticises every day. It is criticism, but consistent with its actions. Continuing with the idea of ridicule of this attitude, the composition of the industrial environment, it "takes industry's side" in the sense that it humanises it, as if it was a person. The objective is for the viewer to identify with the machine and not to see it as something cold, alien and mechanical. To make this mechanicity into a perception of strength, power, rhythm and energy; to experience all these sensations, but not externally as a spectator, but instead within the machine itself, identifying what is heard with what is being represented, and in the transmission of the energy of what is represented to the viewer.

* Urban composition (2004)

An interface recreating an urban landscape. Using 3D graphics and thought-provoking sounds, it expresses a vision of a city as a place of accumulation, where people converge, cultural richness and multiple perceptions. This composition is part of a vision of the city as a place where people converge, which entails cultural richness, an abundance of different points of view, various ways of looking at life, exchange, a wealth of feelings; in short, humanity.

On the one hand, the city is considered in terms of this global idea, in the sense that it could refer to any city in the world, and on the other it comes from, or is developed based on a specific place in Barcelona. The metro transfer passageway between the green line and the yellow line at Passeig de Gràcia is a place through which hundreds and hundreds of people pass every day. On the beams along the passage, acting as milestones along the journey down it, there is or there was a poem, "The Farewell," which reflected on life in its most human sense. It is a reflection on the facts of life from the perspective of a mature person; he talks about if he or she had more time to live, how he or she would live it, what things he or she would make a priority, all of which is spoken from the heart and with sincerity.

Based on a play in the Tantarantana theatre, it creates a story with various African immigrants in Barcelona as the central characters. A report on the culture of African griots, storytellers of ancestral tales who are the repositories of all the knowledge and traditions in several African countries. It creates a story with various African immigrants in Barcelona as the central characters. "Griots" are people who carry their ancestors' roots and express them through various art forms such as music, dance and oral storytelling. It is a mosaic of sounds, images, characters and stories that are intertwined to give the report a coherent meaning.

* Everything for Coexistence (2003)

A television report focusing on criticism of the social services and the government's policies on immigration issues. It documents the experience of 500 people living illegally in a barracks on the outskirts of Barcelona. A historical document showing a place that no longer exists: the police barracks in Torres i Bages in Barcelona's Sant Andreu neighbourhood.

The Council demolished the barracks in 2004 and the vast majority of homeless people that lived there were never found homes in social housing or reintegrated into Spanish society. The project was conceived in terms of an opportunity to enter unexplored territory, a place resembling a jungle and chaos rather than the order that is common in large cities. The report is filmed – apart from the interviews – using the sequence shot technique and steadycam function, to give the document more realism and dynamism. We walk through the entire illegal camp where the authorities do not even dare to enter and even take part in a Sunday football match and eat with them.

* BCN Skate (1999)

* Campo, Landscapes, Places and Tradition (1999)

An experimental piece in video clip format about the village of Campo. An experimental collage mixing video, animation, photography and music. The author's first exercise in style and video production. The source is a home camera and the work involves the montage, using one of the first versions of Adobe Premiere (non-linear digital software) for experiments in the field of video and audio editing. The version moves in a direction from the broadest scenarios (the landscapes of the valley of Benasque), followed by unusual places in the village (places) and some of the activities that characterise its people (tradition). The journey therefore starts on a general plane before moving into the field of the particular, its people's more intimate realm. The video clip was shown for two days at the Traditional Museum of Village Games during the week of culture in 2000.
